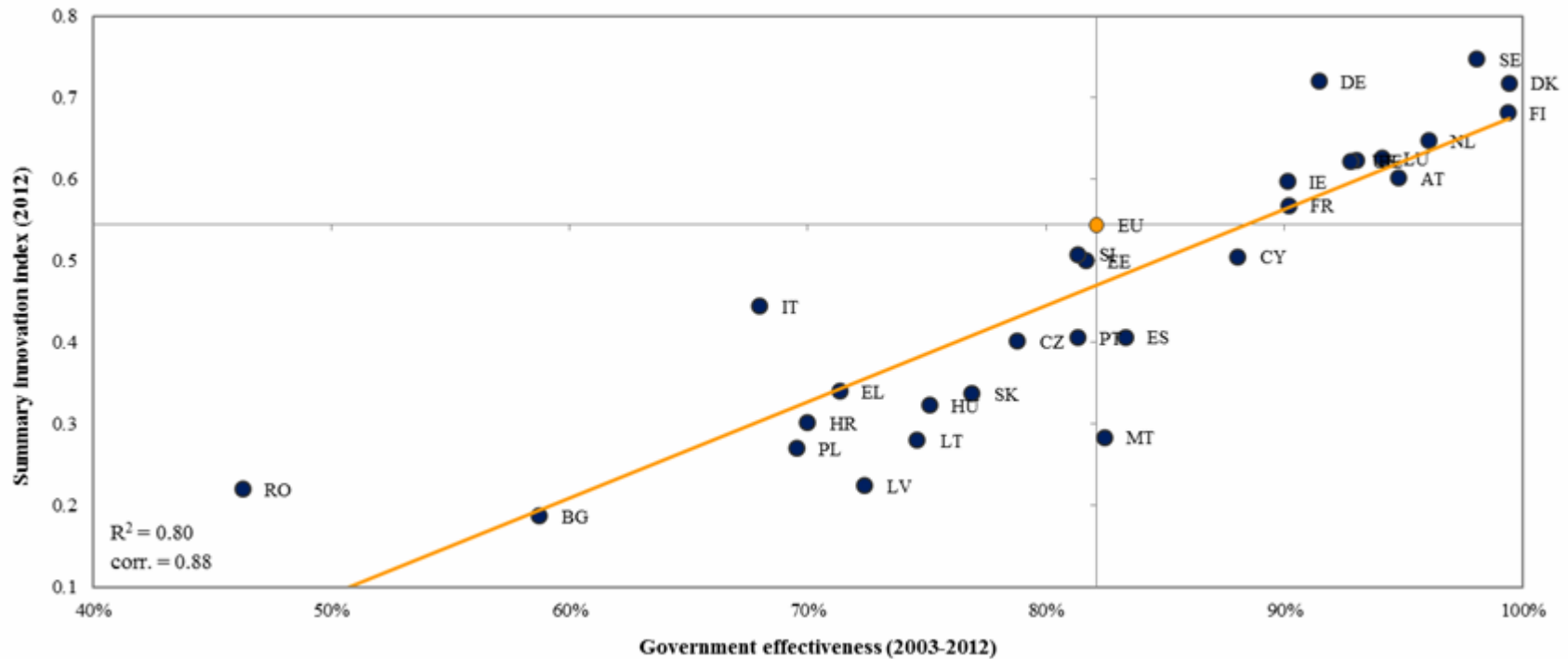

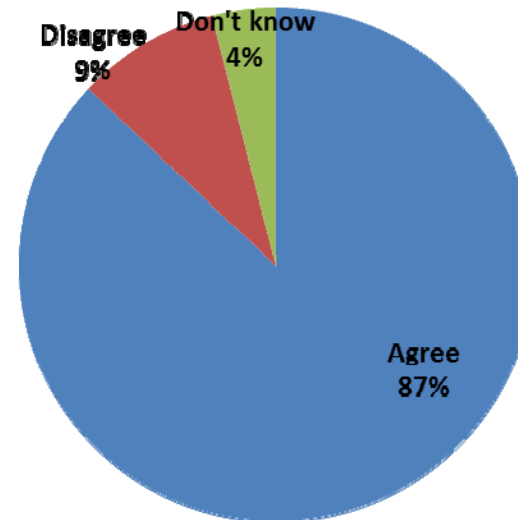
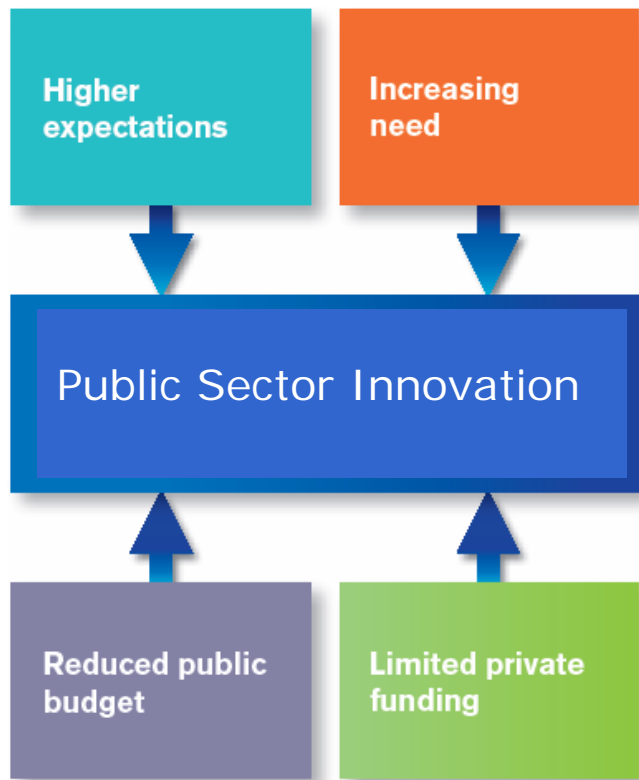

The public sector accounts for 25% of total employment in EU-27

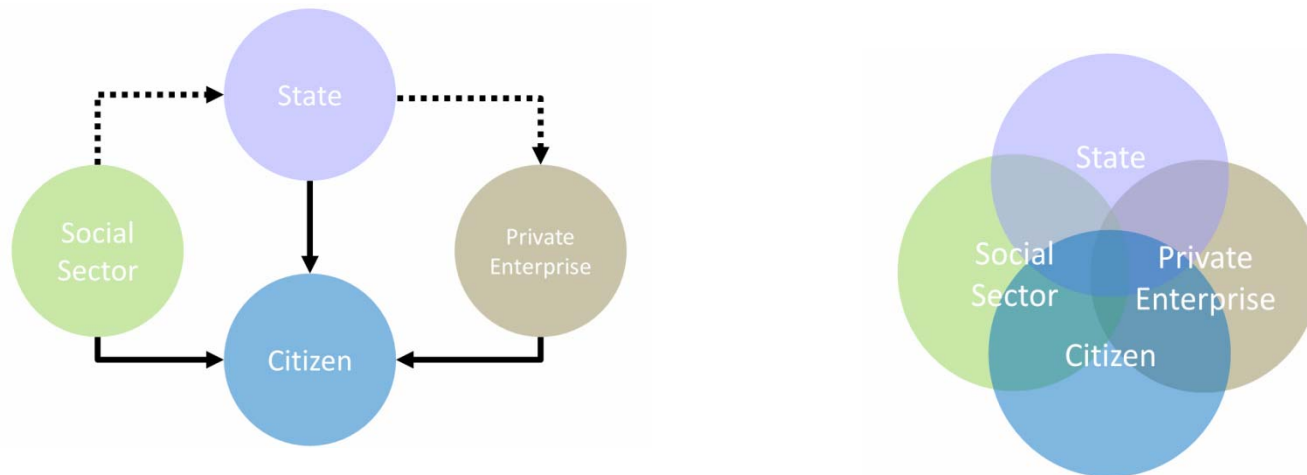

- **ICT tools**, e.g. eGovernment, interconnected services, Electronic ID Interoperability Platform, SOLVIT;
- **Platforms**, e.g. Interoperability Solutions, EIPs;
- **Scoreboards**, e.g. Public Sector Scoreboard, Judicial Efficiency Scoreboard, eGovernment Benchmarking
- **Prizes**, e.g. European Public Service Award, Prize for Innovation in Public Administration, European Capital of Innovation, Award for Public Procurement of Innovation;
